In Falling, performers play 2- and 3-note chords with chopsticks, creating a raucous and noisy music. Over four sections, the four instrumentalists play canons that converge. coming together in the final section. Falling is a companion piece to Rising.

#### Peformer notes:

In the doublestops, the glissando lines should be as loud as the open strings.

Falling can be performed col legno (as opposed to with chopsticks) if desired. When all parts come together at secion D (bar 137), the glissandi sound should be more of an cluster than in unison and octaves.
